Why do we need viable alternatives to tobacco now?

- Historically, tobacco sales account for a big share of Malawi's total export value
- Production is mainly done by smallholder farmers with < 0.5 hectares of farmland</p>
- While tobacco is vital to the Malawian economy, its market is threatened by:
 - Health hazards on both production and consumption sides
 - Child labor and anti-smoking campaigns
 - Production shocks


Tobacco is still vital to the Malawian economy. But what about alternatives?

- Examine trends in tobacco export prices and value
- Analyze the switching in and out of tobacco cultivation

- Estimate the profitability of tobacco and its alternatives
 - Using nationally representative datasets collected between 2009 and 2019

The future of USA market is uncertain





Malawi is already switching out of tobacco





Tobacco is more profitable than alternative crops








Note: All calculations in 2019 MK. Gross margin=Gross revenue-cost of production

Yes, if not tobacco, then what?

Viable commodities

- Cereals (e.g., Maize)
- Legume crops
- Horticultural crops
- Coffee, Tea, Cotton
- Assorted (e.g., Cannabis, Minerals, Wheat, etc)

Key constraints (general)

- Low funding to public R&D
- Poor infrastructure (e.g., road, markets, warehousing)
- Low investment in public extension system
- No input subsidies for other alternatives (e.g., legumes)
- Limited technical knowledge on production



Take home message

- Tobacco prices and export value declined over the past decade
- Malawi is already diversifying away from tobacco production
- For efficient growers, tobacco remains more profitable than most alternatives
- Do we have alternatives? **Yes**, but we need strategies to improve their profitability

Possible policy interventions

Enhance agricultural productivity through more investments in R&D

Explore or develop alternative commodities for export diversification

Invest in agro-processing for high value crops for export markets

Make agri-policies more consistent and predictable (e.g., maize export ban)
